#### **Approval of Changes to General Law of the Order**

All proposed changes to the General Law of the Order were approved at the Moose International Annual Convention in Las Vegas, NV. There were two categories on the ballot, with each requiring a separate yes/no vote.

Category 1 [Vote count: 1672 yes / 131 no 92.7% approval]

The following changes were approved and become effective on August 1, 2019:

- Dues paid by a member shall be credited as of the date the dues are posted by Moose International (not by the Administrator). [Section 30.3]
- Any active Lodge member may purchase a life membership in his Lodge by paying to Moose International the *sum designated by the Supreme Council* (not a specific value specified in the General Law). [Section 31.1]
- Change the name of the Committee to *Financial Review* Committee (in lieu of Auditing Committee); with all responsibilities remaining unchanged. [Section 43.5]

Category 2 [Vote count: 1397 yes / 404 no 77.6% approval] The change in this category becomes effective January 1, 2020. Basically prohibits the use of any tobacco product or smoking device (including e-cigarettes) at any time in the social quarters or lodge home. It does allow the use of tobacco product or smoking device (including e-cigarettes) in lawful outdoor areas or areas for which the General Governor's Office has provided a dispensation. In addition, the use of all cannabis products is absolutely prohibited at any time in the Social Quarters, lodge home, or on lodge property. [Section 48.2]

Please note that the Arlington #1315 Moose Lodge has not determined as of this date how to comply with the "No Smoking Policy" [Category 2]. Suggestions from all the members of the Arlington Fraternity on how to address this requirement will be solicited by the Board of Officers during the next few months.





#### **The Arlington Moose Legion Committee Corner**

A thank you is extended to Gregg Cady for volunteering to be the Chairman and Dean Massey for volunteering to be the Vice-Chairman in the Arlington Moose Legion Committee for the 2019-2020 Moose Year.

In an effort to attract our Legionnaires to attend the monthly Moose Legion Committee meetings, the meetings were changed to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday each month (in lieu of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday after the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday) in order to help our members remember that Tuesdays are always meeting days. To further entice attendance at the Moose Legion Committee meetings, a **food offering has been re-established after the meetings** for a reasonable price. In order to alleviate a burden on any member to prepare the food, purchased restaurant plain cheese and pepperoni pizza will be offered at a price per slice at each meeting (based on the total cost paid). We purchased too much pizza at the July meeting; but that gave us a benchmark for future meetings. It's all good!

#### **Lodge Repairs/Replacements**

#### **Let's Talk** (A Message from the Administrator)

Financially, the Arlington Fraternity is SOLID with money in the bank! But there are some major expenses that are being considered for the future. First, the Lodge will be submitting for a grant from Moose International to recondition the two main restrooms of the Social

Quarters (both Men & Women) with respect to the tile walls, the floors, plumbing devices, and new electrical lighting. If the grant is not awarded, the Lodge may still consider performing the work. A very expensive proposal has been received to replace a portion of the asphalt in the road entrance of the Lodge (which includes reducing the steep hill) and repairs of pot holes in the exit of the roadway from the Lodge and along the kitchen side of the Lodge. 


