Youth Awareness Program




Even though it seems that information is almost immediately available from sources in today's world, the receiver can always screw up the information if not concentrating. It seems that the information in the last Newsletter was not correct with respect to the current Virginia Moose Youth PROGRAM Awareness Program. There were 16 students (not 15 students) that

completed their minimum 3 KidTalk presentations, written reports, and video. Furthermore, the "Team Virginia" will be represented by 8 high school students (not 5 students) at the 2021 Moose International Youth Awareness Program Student Congress in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina on April 22nd - 26th, 2021 [Note: the Administrator is getting old, but he cannot figure out how he screwed up so badly].

The VMA Chairman and coordinators had a difficult task of narrowing the 16 submitted documents to 10 students to be judged. Those 10 presentations, written reports and videos were then judged by an English class at Fort Defiance High School to ensure the final delegate selection was done by a group of peers of the students. The eight delegates selected to represent the Commonwealth of Virginia at the 2021 Moose International Youth Awareness Program Student Congress are listed on Page 6.

It is noted that the student which was sponsored by the Arlington Moose Lodge #1315 was not one of the 8 students selected to attend the 2021 Moose International Youth Awareness Program Student Congress; however, he did receive a \$100.00 reward for completing the requirements of the program.


Pandemic Relief Grants for the Lodges

This pandemic relief program follows last May's initial \$1 million pandemic relief initiative that granted as much as \$5,000 each as COVID-19 was just starting to impact their business. Submitted applications were received in

February and in March. As a result of this program, 369 Lodges received funds to help pay needed expenses Previously, the Supreme Council allocated \$1 million per year since 2014 for Lodges to apply for improvements/infrastructure programs that would make the Lodges more appealing and comfortable for its current and prospective members.

Lodge Repairs/Replacements

The Lodge had a lot of irons in the fire during the month of March with respect to facility fixes.

As implied in the previous month's Newsletter, the Lodge did have a situation with the hot water system. There were two hot water tanks in the system and both had suddenly become dysfunctional (at least to our knowledge when there was no longer any hot water). One of the hot water tanks was declared "dead with no possible resurrection" and the other hot water tank needed a new controller (actual parts unknown by the Administrator) which was replaced by a commercial vendor. However, during the replacement of the new controller, the very old existing water shut-off valve for the hot water system broke in the closed position. Hot water is a "must" in the operations of the Lodge, especially for our members to wash their hands and in the washing of cooking items. The Lodge wants to express our appreciation to thank Larry Edmonds and Bruce Pickett for their efforts in resolving the emergency to provide water to the hot water system, which included providing a new water shut-off valve and reconfiguring the piping to eliminate the unrepairable tank from the hot water system. It is believed that the hot water demand of the current operations of the Lodge will be met with only the one hot water tank. Later after the emergency was resolved, a new burner assembly was ordered and installed.

The newly upgraded fire extinguishing system for the kitchen hood was installed as scheduled. A thank you is expressed to Bruce Pickett for being at the Lodge to assist as necessary in the installation; not to mention providing access for the workers into the Lodge earlier than the normal opening for our members. It took some time to get the Lodge in compliance with the current Fire Codes ... but the end is getting close. Fairfax County still needs to inspect and approve the installation.

Remember the long-standing saga about the leak in the Men's Restroom of the Social Quarters? This time the challenge of finding the leak was tackled by Larry Edmonds and Bruce Pickett. AND they found and repaired the LEAKS (more than just one)! It took cutting two holes in the cinder block wall, with one along the floor line that expanded below two of the wall urinals, and also expanding the existing wall cut-outs behind all three of the wall urinals. There were three sections of the piping that needed to be repaired. Thank you, Larry Edmonds and Bruce Pickett. We also want to thank Billy Hensley for installing a temporary

cover over the hole in the wall beneath the wall urinals while a permanent solution to cover the holes are determined and implemented.

Lodge Repairs/Replacements (continued)

And plumbing problems kept coming. One of the sinks in the restrooms of the Ritual Hall was clogged, so Larry Edmonds snaked the drain piping to resolve the situation.

Did you know that the old light fixtures from the kitchen were saved? There were several light fixtures within the Ritual Hall that were not working, so the thought was to use any "good" old kitchen light fixtures as total replacements or for some of their parts. A thank you is expressed to Bruce Pickett and Clifton Ballance for fixing the light fixtures in the Ritual Hall and replacing any burnt-out florescent bulbs. All lighting within the Ritual Hall is now operational (and all remaining pieces of the old kitchen lighting fixtures have been trashed). In addition, the Lodge wants to thank Bruce Pickett for replacing the dimmer switch associated with the three fan lighting assemblies within the Ritual Hall to stop the lights from alternating between full bright and dimming while being on. In addition, he replaced the battery for the telephone system which nobody else observed was in a trouble alarm condition.

The Lodge wants to thank Bernie Cerroni for coordinating the inspection of the boiler for the bi-annual license period and to Bruce Pickett for being at the Lodge to assist in showing the insurance inspector our layout of the Lodge.

Let's Talk (A Message from the Administrator)

As noted in the article about Lodge replacement/fixes for the Lodge, there have been a considerable amount of expenses during the month of March. It is noted that that the Lodge, at this time, seems to only

make substantial income when social events happen, as the income from routine operations during the week basically just covers the employee wages and routine expenses (e.g.: utilities, insurance, etc.). We still have sufficient funds in the bank to compensate for unexpected expenses ... so no worries yet! However, in the upcoming months, the Lodge will have to consider implementing some changes to increase our income; e.g.: dealing with beverages, re-establishing previously "normal" weekly activities when it makes sense, and especially more social fraternal events. 

This will be my last article for the Lodge Newsletter as Governor. In fact. this will be the last "Governor's Corner" ever. At the next installation, the office of Governor will be renamed Lodge President. Just one more year and I look forward to seeing some of the women step up and make their mark on the Lodge Board.

On the lighter side, I've been seeing a few interesting recipes for Cicadas. Not only are they low in carbs and gluten free, their taste is supposedly similar to soft shell crabs with subtle overtones of boiled peanuts. Your Cicadas can be chocolate covered, baked, stir-fried, made into cookies, grilled, served with grits, boiled, barbequed, added to pizza toppings and many other dishes - too many to be listed here. This has inspired me to come up with a few dishes of my own: Cicadas in the air fryer - not recommended. Cicadas in a hot air popcorn popper - definitely not recommended. But I settled on one I can live with. I call it "Cicadas on the Patio"

Equipment: 1 shoe box - holes punched out

1 seafood steamer

1 patio

heat source for boiling water

6 large, active Cicadas per person Ingredients

Enough water to fill pot just below the steamer basket

Seafood seasoning (more is better)

Cocktail sauce (Homemade or store bought)

1/2 pound shrimp per person

Catch Cicadas and keep fresh and lively in the shoebox. Pet the cat. Put water in the steamer and bring to a boil. Get the cat off the table. Get the cat off the table again. Add a handful of seafood seasoning to the boiling water. Make sure the cat isn't taking a nap. This is an important part of the process. Put the shrimp in the steamer and add another handful of seafood seasoning on top of the shrimp. Cover and cook for 3 or 4 minutes until done. Dump the box of Cicadas on the patio. Eat the shrimp while watching the cat chase the Cicadas. This should be perfect for a summer evening get together.
