



Membership Appreciation Breakfast - November 1st






Honor Our Veterans Celebration November 11th (Veterans Day)

Watch 2020 College Football Bowl Games at the Lodge

At present, there are 39 bowl games, including the first round of the College Football Playoffs (i.e.: Semifinals). So 78 teams will earn bowl bids. In previous years when teams were allowed to play 12-game schedules, a minimum of six wins was required to be eligible

for a bowl game. However, with shortened seasons of lesser games and game cancellations due to COVID-19, there is no requirement to be eligible for selection to play in a bowl game. The plan, for now, is that the College Football Playoff selection committee will select its four teams for the two Semifinal games on December 20th and the bowl selections will soon follow.



Lodge Repairs/Replacement

The Lodge is still trying to determine the next step in resolving the kitchen hood not being compliant to the fire codes; so that the kitchen fire extinguisher system can be upgraded. The Lodge wants to thank Billy Hensley and Bernie Cerroni in pursuing this matter with a discussion with the Fairfax County Fire Marshal. *More to come*.

Another saga ... the leak in the Men's Restroom of the Social Quarters. The thought of the sanitary pipe associated with the wall urinal above floor leak was investigated. The wall urinal was removed, the input sanitary line of the removed urinal was plugged, and the other two wall urinals were flushed many times with no noticeable leak on the floor [the Administrator kept shrieking about the water bill]. The pipes above the ceiling were again investigated and there was evidence of "sludge" on the plumbing vent pipe to maybe indicate a leak in the roof. The problem is the leak still appears on a continuous basis and there was no rain to cause the roof to leak. *Again, more to come*. The Lodge wants to thank Gregg Cady, Andre McFail, Bruce Picckett, Tom Oderwald, and Alex Wantrobski for trying to resolve this problem.

If you have not noticed, since March the Lodge has not had flags on the two flag poles in front of the Lodge. The previous existing flags had deteriorated due to the weather and were taken down [an appropriate "burning" will be provided by a local American Legion]. The Lodge wants to thank Dean Massey for having new flag pole lines with flag clips installed and then hanging a new American flag, Commonwealth of Virginia flag, and P.O.W. flag on the two flag poles before Veteran's Day.

Have you experienced a thump, thump while driving into and exiting the Lodge? There were several major pot holes in the driveway of the entrance and exit of the Lodge. The Lodge wants to thank Clifton Ballance for filling the pot holes with temporary asphalt cold patch. Unfortunately, the Lodge does not have the appropriate funds to re-pave the asphalt at this time.

Is it not any wonder why the Administrator does not sleep at night worrying about the Lodge? For the record, the Lodge also has to consider the repair of the old beer keg dispenser behind the bar, so that larger kegs can be purchased for consumption.


I think all these people are required for the job. The first two are doing what is needed to complete the project. The third member is learning how it's done so that when it's their turn they will know how to do it and what is needed.







The Girls are getting older and have outgrown the size of the Virginia Home. Therefore, the Girls along with their Family Teachers have been moved to a larger home on campus. Since the Virginia Home is a smaller facility, International plans to temporarily use it in a very vital role as they continue to bring new students to the Mooseheart Campus. They cannot protect the staff and students already there without having a home where new students can be quarantined before entering the Mooseheart population. The Virginia Home will temporarily become that home. The Virginia Home will be instrumental in helping to bring in the students who are sitting on the waiting list – waiting for the opportunity Mooseheart provides.
