




CHILI will be offered as the main "munchie" for this event! Come enjoy the **BIG GAME** at the Lodge where







Bailey's Crossroads Rotary Club (BXRC) Inclement Meals Packaging Event January 11th

Approximately 100 volunteers gathered Saturday at the Arlington #1315 Moose Lodge to assemble 15,000 meals for our community. Rotarians were joined by members of Moose, Lions, FCPS students/staff, Food Uniting Neighbors (FUN), and more! Thank you to all those that participated in this community event.

Each meal pack contains six meals. We assembled 2,412 rice/bean packs and 108 oat meal packs. All of the ingredients and equipment for the event were arranged by the Outreach Program. Outreach was founded by Rotarians in Iowa and has spread across the United States. Our local Outreach volunteers for this effort are Bobby and Michelle Polito, who operate from Arlington, VA.

The rice/bean packs were delivered to three local schools: Bailey's Upper Elementary School, Glen Forest Elementary School, and Parklawn Elementary School. These items will be distributed to students by the principal prior to an inclement weather day for students to eat while at home.

The oatmeal packs were a new addition to our effort this year. Shout out to Rotarian Juanita Balenger for her help in working with Fairfax Area on Aging to identify senior recipients at the Bailey's Senior Center and Lincolnia Senior Apartments. We look forward to working with more groups who can help us to identify and support seniors in our community.

Meals were delivered Monday afternoon in record time by Rotarians Carl Neuberg, Bob Polson, Dennis Shannon, and special guest community member Reid Voss (both for the extra muscle and for bringing his truck); Anita O'Quinn lent her van to the delivery cause!

Award of Achievement (8th Consecutive Year)

"One Moose" Vote Scheduled for the Milwaukee Convention

The concept of "One Moose", was first mentioned by Director General Scott Hart at the 2019 International Convention. This concept was next described in detail to over 600 Moose members who attended the One Moose Town Hall Meeting in Orlando, Florida on November 2, 2019.

At this point in time, the concept now advances to the desire of the Supreme Council and Grand Council to create One Moose and to do it as quickly as possible. A vote by the Loyal Order of Moose delegates on changes to the General Laws is planned during the 2020 International Moose Convention in Milwaukee. Should the proposal pass, the Moose Fraternity becomes "One Moose" on May 1, 2021.

Lodge Repairs/Replacement

The next step of the restoration of the restrooms of the Social Quarters was to deal with the terrazzo floors. The original plan was to apply a new surface coating (i.e.: applicable special paint) on the floor; however, it was suggested at the last moment that we should

attempt to try to recondition the existing terrazzo flooring to possibly reduce the cost of this portion of the restoration; and if it was not acceptable, we would proceed with our original plan. The flooring reconditioning was performed in January and except for a few areas along the perimeter wall areas, the shine from the flooring has been reestablished (everyone thinks that the flooring is wet when they look down). It was agreed that the original plan could be forgotten. Hopefully, we can have the cost for the reconditioning of the floors paid by the grant awarded to the Lodge from Moose International; but it was a change from the original submission in the grant application and could be the cost of the Lodge.


