**Main Charities of the Moose**

Men's Lodges and the Ladies Chapters across the fraternity contribute to Moose-sponsored programs such as **Mooseheart**, which is a 1,200 acre Illinois home and school for children in need. **Moosehaven**, a retirement home for Moose and their wives, was founded in 1922 on the banks of the St. John's River at Orange Park, 14 miles south of Jacksonville, Florida. There are more than 30 buildings on about 60 acres of land, with more than a third of a mile of river frontage. "Every resident whose physical condition will permit is assigned to some daily duty usually not to exceed three hours," and everyone receives a monthly allowance. Those no longer able to work are called "Sunshiners." Their job is to sit in rocking chairs in the sun, and smile at passers-by. There is a well-equipped 150 bed hospital, in addition to many other facilities.

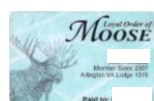
Aside from **Mooseheart** and **Moosehaven**, Moose Lodges also support a number of health oriented charities, such as the March of Dimes, Muscular Dystrophy, Heart Fund, Cancer Crusade, Cerebral Palsy, and much more. Many Lodges are also active in highway safety, Boys and Girl Scouting, safe surfing on the Internet, civil defense cooperation and local community activities of all kinds.

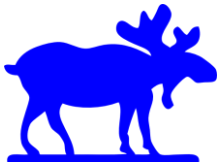

**Mooseheart's Centennial Celebration - July 27, 2013**



Ever since its dedication on July 27, 1913, Mooseheart Child City & School has given a home, education and stability to more than 12,000 children from across the continent, and the world.

Exactly 100 years later - Saturday, July 27, 2013 - will be an all-day celebration of Mooseheart's mission and successes, as thousands of Moose members, Mooseheart alumni and members of the community will mark the history and the future of the community, with a 100-minute fun run, hours of free live entertainment, a carnival, food-and-beverage tents, fireworks at dusk—and by breaking ground on a \$10 million renovation project of Mooseheart School. From 9:00 a.m. through until after dark, it's the **Mooseheart Centennial Celebration!**

A rededication ceremony for Mooseheart, honoring Mooseheart founder James J. Davis and first Superintendent Rodney Brandon, and featuring remarks from former U.S. House Speaker Dennis Hastert, will highlight festivities. To start the events will be the 100-minute Centennial Challenge Walk/Run; and following throughout the afternoon will be a full carnival and pony rides, musical entertainment throughout the day including Rick K and the Allnighters and the Beatles tribute band "American English," food/beer/soft drink tents, a petting zoo, a groundbreaking ceremony for the Mooseheart School renovation, and at dusk, a spectacular fireworks display.



Activities for the expansion of the bar will begin in July, which will include a new display case for WOTM in the entrance hallway.

**Donation to Children's National Medical Center**



In participation with a program sponsored by the VMA District IV, our Lodge provided a donation last summer to the Children's National Medical Center for the purchase of EZ-IO Intraosseous Infusion Systems for their emergency response teams.

This portable medical equipment provides immediate vascular access to the central circulation, via the marrow of a bone, for delivering medications, intravenous fluids and blood products. This technique is used in emergency situations when intravenous access is not available or not feasible; such as no vein is clearly visible. Currently, this equipment is utilized in cardiac arrest and resuscitation situations. Furthermore, the equipment is contained within red backpacks that have the Loyal of the Moose logo proudly displayed.
