





International Moose Convention

[from Official Communications on April 3, 2020]

Despite the cancellation of activities in Milwaukee, Moose leadership will be working to develop a "virtual convention" that can be accessed by delegates and other members via any computer, tablet

or phone that possesses internet access. It is anticipated that this virtual meeting will be moved to June 25-26, 2020 to make sure the delivery of information is complete, simple and accessible.

Included in this virtual meeting will be all major reports traditionally delivered at the convention along with a number of prerecorded sessions that members can watch at their leisure. Instructions on how to participate, along with downloadable materials, will be provided via the Moose International website (www.mooseintl.org) prior to the meeting.


The General Governor has confirmed that the virtual meeting will fall within the parameters of the General Laws, and that the actions taken by the delegates through votes online will be binding. These online votes (registered LOOM delegates only) will include the General Law Amendments that seek to establish a new lodge format (i.e.: "One Moose") that gives members equal rights and opportunities regardless of gender.

Supreme Council Grant Program for Covid-19 Relief

[from Official Communications on April 3, 2020]

The Supreme Council Pandemic Relief Fund program is being created to help lodges pay expenses incurred during lodge closures due to the coronavirus. Examples include mortgage payments, utility bills, insurance premiums,

property taxes and other expenses in which the lodge does not have the financial means, through cash, savings or investments, to meet obligations.

Applications for relief will appear in the Moose Admin section (Moose International website) for each lodge on Monday, April 27th and lodges will be awarded grants up to \$5,000 based on financial need and fraternal history. Application reviews by the Moose International Field staff may start as early as May 1st and grant funds may be approved by the middle of May.

There is no end date, as of now, to apply for the SCPRF grant. Applications and reviews will be ongoing and grants will be awarded until the funding limit is reached. Like always, Arlington #1315 Moose Lodge will submit an application.

Planned MI LOOM Dues Increase has been deferred



The Supreme Council voted to forego the dues increase of \$2.00 that was expected to go into effect this August for all Loyal Order of Moose members. This increase was part of a three-part dues revision that saw \$2 increases in both 2016 and 2018. The ABCD portion of the dues remitted to Moose International will remain at \$38.00. This means that the Arlington #1315

Moose Lodge will retain \$7.00 for each member that pays his dues of \$45.00 each in the upcoming year; instead of \$5.00.

Please remember that there is No Smoking nor Tobacco Products allowed in the Moose Lodge when it is Re-Opened Again

It has not been formally informed to our membership that violation of this official Moose Smoking Policy restriction, that began on January 1, 2020, will result in the following consequences:

• 1st offense: LOOM Board will received a non-compliance letter of the

violation;

• 2nd Offense: Current LOOM Board is removed:

3rd Offense: Lodge operation is suspended for at least 3 days; and
 Final Offense: Lodge charter is removed (i.e.: Lodge terminated to exist).

Please note that Moose International has the right to remove the Lodge charter if it is determined that the Lodge blatantly defies this rule restriction!!

A Personal Experience of how the Covid-19 virus is changing our World

In the middle of March, we (Roxanne & John) received a mail card from our cable company that they were upgrading their television system and we needed to request different cable receiver devices. As instructed, we called and ordered to have the new receiver devices mailed to us. Unfortunately, the cable company changed the transmission format for our television before we received the new receiver devices. Suddenly, everything went "blank" at 8:00pm on our two main cable control box televisions (in Roxanne's den and the Master Bedroom). Roxanne panicked, as she could no longer watch CCN for further status of the virus and John could not watch the Hallmark channel to be put to sleep (*he's seen every story at least three times*)! We called, but the mailed new receiver devices were not expected until the next day – the cable company's mistake. WHAT ... we had to talk to each other or read a book instead of our normal routine!

Nothing happened, and we were told that we had connected the incorrect device as the "master" for the system to operate and that the existing cable to the new receiver device needed to be replaced. We installed the second receiver device and still a "blank screen" on the television. We agreed to try to install the receiver devices in the Master Bedroom the next day, as the existing antenna cable from the wall to the new receiver device needed to be replaced. MORE READING for John to go to sleep (which he hates)!

It should be noted that John hurt his back moving his wardrobe to get to the cable wall connector and installing a new shorter cable in Roxanne's den. **They came but we did the work!**







MOOSEHEART CAMP ROSS

Mooseheart Camp Ross

Mooseheart Camp Ross provides year-round camping facilities for the Mooseheart children. It is located near Mount Morris, IL, about 70 miles west of Mooseheart. The camp consists of approximately 150 acres (actually 139.19 acres) of rolling woodlands, fishing streams, lakes and ponds. Mooseheart children spend vacation time at Camp Ross each summer and during the winter months.

It all started when Harold Ross (sales director executive of the printing firm that printed the Moose Magazine) and his wife Dorothy gave the entire property to Mooseheart in 1957. Thanks to \$100,000 invested by the Moose Legion and three years of work by Mooseheart staff and students, Camp Ross was officially dedicated as part of the 72nd Moose International Convention held in Chicago, IL (June 1960). It is noted that additional acreage was later acquired in several purchases. The camp consists of a Guest House, six rustic wooden cabins, chapel, director's cabin, swimming pool with bathhouse, basketball court, recreation and dining building, summer-winter Bunk House, four utility buildings, hiking trails, and lots of forest.

Generally each Home at Mooseheart schedule a week to spend at camp each summer. The kids are able to bunk together in the cabins (each with six to eight beds and a few bathrooms). The Family Teachers have their own cabin. The kids are able to go hiking, do crafts, hold bon fires after collecting sticks, and of course tell stories and perform skits. At the end of the week, the entire group will stay in the Bunk House. That way all the kids would share one big room, and let loose for one last night before heading back to Mooseheart.

With the exception of the dining and recreation building and the Walter Ketz Memorial Chapel, which was financed by the Mooseheart Alumni Association, all of the buildings and the camp's continuous operation are financed exclusively by the Moose Legion.

This past 2019-2020 Moose Year, the Moose Legions contributed to a fundraiser for providing equipment at Camp Ross (a goal of \$100,000 pro-rated over the entire Moose Legion active membership), and for the scholarships provided in the Moose International Youth Awareness Program. In addition, the Moose Legions were asked to contribute to a fundraiser, "Moose Legion President's Project", to purchase some vehicles (e.g.: an extended golf cart type) to be used for tours and other people moving needs around the campus. The assessment for the Bull Run Moose Legion #185 for this year was \$1,674.00 for the camp equipment and scholarships (not considering a discount for early submission). The Arlington Moose Legion Committee made our required contribution of \$140.76 towards the Bull Run obligation.

Mooseheart Camp Ross Trivia Facts

[Provided by Dave Schabacker of Rochelle, IL Lodge #903]

- In 1937, Harold D. Ross bought the initial 75 acres of land and then an additional 10 acres in 1939 to help straighten the boundary lines. To protect the land from further erosion, the Ross family planted a total of 15,000 trees (white pine, oak, ash, jack pine & black cherry) between 1941 through 1944.
- Moose Legionnaire Harold Ross (member of Mt. Morris Moose Lodge #1551 since 1931) and Director General Paul P. Schmitz negotiated the transfer of the Ross property in 1957. It is noted that Harold Ross served as Supreme Governor of the Moose organization from 1966-1967.
- At the request of "Grand Herder" (why was this great title not kept?) Lance J.
 Spenser, the entire operational budget of Camp Ross was assumed ny the Moose
 Legion in 1986. The support of Camp Ross became part of each Moose
 Legionnaire's annual dues in 1994.
- There are six cabins for the children at Mooseheart when they visit and the cabins are named for 6 different Indian tribes: Sioux ("little snakes"), Illini (ordinary speaker"), Winnebago ("people of stinky water"), Ottowa ("traders"), Sac ("person of the outlet"), and Fox ("renards").

The month of May is named for the Greek goddess Maia; who oversaw the growth of plants
