



After the Legion Breakfast, stay to watch the Washington Redskins play the New England Patriots at 1:00pm.






9th Annual Bill Lewis Memorial Chili Cook-Off on Saturday, October 26th

VMA 2nd Annual Heart of the Community Chili Cook-Off - September 21st at Lynchburg-South #1727

The Arlington Team was ready for this adventure and gave every effort at the competition to proudly represent District 4 AND OUR LODGE! Our journey started with confusion on the timeline of the cook-off event once the Team arrived in Lynchburg, VA; as no defined schedule was actually provided in the advanced received documentation. In discussions with several other competitors and judges at the motel where we were staying, it was decided that 7:00am was the appropriate time to get to the competition site at the Lynchburg South Moose Family Center #1872 (no weekend relaxation for the Team ... they had to get up to be ready by 6:00am). Furthermore, it was discovered when the Arlington Team arrived at the competition site that several of the other competitors had already set up their basic tent booths the day before. As most of the Arlington Team arrived at Lynchburg around 9:00pm the night before, the set up was not considered critical. However, the new known requirement to have the chili ready for the general public to taste by 10:00am on the competition day became problematic. The Arlington Team was under the opinion that the chili offering had to be ready around 3:00pm from the forwarded instructions for the blind judging, with the general public tasting occurring after giving samples for the judging. The various meats in our chili were frozen when we arrived at the competition which presented the Arlington Team some difficulties in the cooking on the onset, but was overcome. In the end, our Team was ready for the general public to taste at the deadline. Then, after having the chili ready for the general public tastings, the situation of keeping the prepared chili hot and not over cooked for 5 hours (deleted moisture dried out) had to be dealt with. Again, the Team believed they took the appropriate lastminute cooking actions for an acceptable chili mixture for the judging.

The comments heard from the general public when they tasted our chili was very positive, as most individuals liked the "chucky" texture of the various meats and the three beans provided in the chili. But only the blind judging counts in the competition for representing Virginia Moose Association at Moosehaven In November. The final results of the competition was that the Arlington Team came in 4th Place ... tied with 7

other VMA Districts (*VMA only announced the top three (3) winners, so what else should we believe*). It should be noted that the Arlington Team met the new Supreme Governor, Rodney Hammond who attended the VMA event. Pictures of the event are on Page 16.

On the Community Service aspect for the event, \$4,225.00 was raised from the donations of the Lodges and the VMA to benefit the "K9s for Warriors" organization and presented at the event.

A special thank you is extended to Lynchburg South Moose Lodge Family Center #1727 and Chapter #1415 for their efforts and a welcoming environment in hosting this event.

Lodge Grant Program

YES ... the Arlington Fraternity received a \$2,500.00 grant from Moose International towards the cost of reconditioning the two main restrooms of the Social Quarters (both Men & Women) with respect to the tile walls, the floors, plumbing devices, and new lighting. The received grant will only cover a partial amount of the estimated cost for the project; but we appreciate the assistance from the Moose

organization to improve the appearance of our Lodge. More information will follow in the upcoming months as planning and implementation of the project are finalized.



Mooseheart Founder's Day - October 27th

It is James J. Davis who is duly honored as Mooseheart's founder, for he conceived the Child City concept—and tirelessly sold hundreds of thousands of men on the idea.

In 1906, the Moose was an 18-year-old fraternal order on the verge of extinction. Davis, who marked his 33rd birthday on October 27, 1906, joined the Loyal Order of Moose that evening as its 247th member. His

ambitious goal was to build a stronger organization by increasing the number of Lodges across North America. He and a team of lieutenants increased membership from 247 to over 400,000 in less than seven years. By doing so, the Moose was able to accomplish the second part of Davis' plan: to create and sustain a "City of Children", where the children of members could live comfortably and be educated if the member was disabled or died prematurely. And since 1913, Mooseheart has helped nearly 12,000 children reach their fullest potential. Since 1994, these children needn't be from Moose families; rather, the organization has evolved with society, knowing that a kind and helping hand reaches beyond borders.

This is why we are members of the Moose Organization!

Fire Prevention Week

This yearly event was initiated by President Calvin Coolidge in 1925 to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of October 8-10, 1871. The fire killed approximately 300 people, destroyed roughly 3.3 square miles of the city, and left more than 100,000 residents homeless. The fire is claimed to have started at about 9:00 p.m. on October 8, in or around a small barn belonging to the O'Leary family. City officials never determined the exact cause of the blaze; however, the most popular tale blames Mrs. O'Leary's cow, who allegedly knocked over a lantern.




