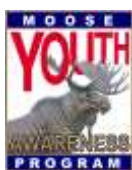
**Welcome Back Cookout – August 1<sup>st</sup>**

There was nothing but raves about the delicious and hot food! The food offering was hot dogs & hamburgers, French fries, baked beans, potato salad, and watermelon. Many members wanted to “jazz up” their order, which led to the chefs providing cheese and bacon for the hamburgers. The Lodge aims to please!

We want to first express our gratitude to all our members who came to the Lodge to enjoy the offered food (all-you-can-eat and “to-go” boxes). Then we want to thank the team of Marty Medel, Andre McFail, Dean Massey, Sara Wick, Sonia Bouadis, and Kristin Medel for their efforts in planning the event, purchasing the necessary food and items, preparing and cooking the food, serving the food, collecting the money, and performing the dreaded cleanup after the event. For the record, this was the first time since anyone can remember where the condiments were provided in individual packets (ketchup, mustard, relish, mayonnaise, salt, pepper).

The Lodge learned a lesson from this event. Our members expressed their delight with the food being fresh and hot since the food was provided as they ordered; instead of the offering being served in a buffet setting with the food being warmed in the steam table. **Lodge Repairs/Replacement**

The Lodge passed the re-inspection by the Fairfax County Fire Department on August 6, 2020. The Lodge wants to thank Thomas Oderwald and John Matis for correcting the two extension deficiencies (when the Lodge was closed during Tropical Storm Isaias) that were noted in the first inspection in July.

The Lodge is getting close to completing the restoration of the Men’s Restroom in the Social Quarters. The Lodge wants to thank Bruce Pickett for replacing the light fixture over the three sinks. With the new light fixtures previously installed in the ceiling and this new light fixture above the sinks, our LOOM members will need to wear sun glasses (as well as the required face masks) when occupying this room. The final step in the restoration of the Men’s Restroom in the Social Quarters is the painting of the walls, which could be paid by the Arlington Moose Legion Committee, who had approved funds toward the restoration.

The Lodge wants to apologize for the loss of the air conditioning during the period of Friday night, August 21<sup>st</sup> and Tuesday afternoon, August 25<sup>th</sup>. What happened is a mystery; but we want to thank our new HVAC service company for figuring out the controls of our “ancient” system to get it working again. Thank you members and guests who came and supported the Lodge (*also sweated in the heat*) during this environmental conditioning failure! We also want to thank Bruce Pickett for replacing one of the 3 condenser fans; which saved the Lodge a little bit less than half of what it would have costed to have a commercial HVAC service company do the replacement.



Talking about mechanical failures, the Administrator was notified that the ice making machine in the kitchen was not working during the same time as the air conditioning; which meant that ice cube wraps could not be given to our members for their foreheads and/or necks to help the “hot” situation (only kidding, but could have helped). The Lodge wants to thank Andre McFail for doing his “magic” to get the ice making machine to operate again.

While fresh foods are an important part of the food provided to those in need, non-perishables are also needed and easy for you to donate. The organization that the food will be donated to can make the most of your non-perishable food donation when you consider three things: nutrition, usefulness, and quality vs. quantity.

The best non-perishable foods to donate:

- ▶ Canned beans
- ▶ Dry beans
- ▶ Rolled oats
- ▶ Peanut butter, or other nut butters
- ▶ Oatmeal
- ▶ Canned fruit in juice (not in light or heavy syrup)
- ▶ Canned vegetables, with no or low-sodium.
- ▶ Low-sodium soups
- ▶ Diced tomatoes
- ▶ Tomato sauce
- ▶ Canned tuna in water
- ▶ Rice (especially whole grain)
- ▶ Pasta (especially whole grain)
- ▶ Canned vegetables
- ▶ Cooking oils (such as olive oil or canola oil)
- ▶ Flour
